SOIL IMPORTATION PERMIT APPLICATION

Any person wishing to import soil in quantities equal to or larger than 500 cubic yards within the Town of Groton shall file a written application with the Board of Health (286-3), which shall include the following information and documentation:

- Completed Importation Application (attached)
- A written narrative explaining the source and composition of any soil or fill that is subject to regulation, together with any supporting materials to describe such materials.
- Topographical plans depicting existing and proposed grades, if available. (Preferred scale 1:20 or 1:40)
- Laboratory results documenting that the material is non-hazardous "Chapter 286 Hazardous Materials of the Town of Groton's Regulations" to include USEPA methods 8260, 8270, RCRA-5 and PFAS. Results must include maximum contamination levels (MCLS). (not sure if this is how you want this worded) Additional testing is required every 500 cubic yards.

The Board of Health may, prescribe forms for initial applications, extensions, and renewals, and the Board may require additional information as the Board shall deem necessary.
