9. Project basic description: The Groton-Dunstable Regional High School has a track located on campus that is
original to the high school building 2005. The life expectancy of a track is roughly 10 years, before there is a need for
resurfacing. Due to the popularity of this track for students from Groton and Dunstable as well as community member
who enjoy morning walks and runs here the track has worn down and is in need of some base layer crack repair
as well as relining and resurfacing with a rubberized coating.
The track surface is made up of three layers. There is a red rubberized textured top coat, a red urethane base coat,
and the under lying black asphalt. As you can see from the picture below there are spots on the track that have worn
down through the urethane base to the asphalt which makes the surface less durable and less safe for all to use.
In 2015 a representative from a company came out to look at the track and at that time estimated the work would
cost \$115,632.00. Due to the continued deterioration and some additional cracking of the base layer that is evident,
the district reached back out to the same company and they said the project could bid as high as \$150,000 with
todays prices of materials and supplies. This project would of course need to be bid but it was felt a not to exceed
cost of \$150,000 was safe.
I appreciate the consideration for the use of CPA funds to help preserve our recreational space. This same project
is being proposed to Dunstable for their proportion of the cost in an effort to equitably distribute the cost based on the
assessment defined in the regional school district agreement.

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CPA Application 2020-14 Resurfacing the Track at Groton-Dunstable High School additional information.

Project Objectives

The goals of the refinishing of the track project are to restore and preserve a recreational space, increase the safety of the recreation space, and maintain an ADA accessible recreation space in the Town of Groton. Similar projects have been completed in 20+ communities in Massachusetts as identified on the communitypreservation.org data base. One of these projects being the completed restoration of the Middle School track here in Groton.

As an identified recreation provider in the Groton Master Plan we must maintain our programs in safe facilities for students and adults. The current wear on the track at the Groton-Dunstable Regional High School does not provide proper traction and padding required for a safe running/walking track. The restoration of this space will help to maintain the GDRSD as an active responsible recreation provider as it is identified in the Groton Master Plan. Additionally, the track is identified in the 2012 Open Space Asset and Resource Report and should be restored to maintain this space. This restoration project falls right in line with the goal of creating opportunities to enhance recreation programs and provide safe places to continue to grow a sense of recreation and physical wellbeing with all residents, particularly the young residents in town.

This project has received support from the Select Board as well as the Parks Commission in Groton. Both support letters are attached.

Management Plan

Final quotes will be received when snow is clear and the bidders are able to come for a final site inspection. This should take place in mid-April and will be led by the Director of Business and Finance for the Groton Dunstable Regional School District.

The project will be scheduled to begin work the first week in July. This project should take roughly 4 weeks which includes 2 weeks of time for the track to fully cure. The Director of Buildings and Grounds along with his maintenance support staff will be present on the High School ground during the project to monitor progress and assist with unforeseen issues should they exist. Starting the project early in July will provide ample time to complete the project prior to the start of school and be sure that there is some extra time built into the project should weather not cooperate.

Prior to final sign off and invoicing the Director of Buildings and Grounds along with the Director of Business and Finance for the District will inspect the track to ensure proper completion of the work. The Athletic Director will be consulted in the sign off process to ensure expectations are met.

Finally, the CPC will be presented a project completion report with relevant information and project updates. This is anticipated in early August, since the track will need to be completed before the beginning of fall sports and school entering back into session.

• Financing and Funding

The total project cost is anticipated to be under \$150,000, this includes 16% in contingency for potential unforeseen costs. Of this total cost, Groton would be responsible for \$112,607 and Dunstable \$37,393. The entire amount would be due in FY20 when the project is completed. Dunstable's CPC has committed to \$25,000 for the project with the remaining funding coming through the school district's assessment to the town. We have developed a plan with the Town Administrator in Dunstable to adjust the school district assessment at town meeting should there be an issue with the CPC warrant article passing. This will ensure that the funding needed from Dunstable is available and the project is completed in FY20.

The property where the project is proposed is owned and controlled by the Groton-Dunstable Regional School District. Authority to complete this type of work is allowable due to the land ownership. Additionally, since the adoption of the Groton-Dunstable Regional School District plan the district has successfully managed projects ranging from as small as \$10,000 to \$450,000. This type of project will fall in line with similar projects managed and completed successfully.

Financially providing funding for this project through the CPC offers the town of Groton a financial advantage by reducing the required free cash needed for the Groton-Dunstable Capital needs. This will allow funds that had previously been transferred from free cash to stay in the District Capital Account which will require less free cash or other funding from the town in the future. This in turn should help to relieve some of the tax burden to the town in funding all the various department requests and projects.
