## HUNTING IN GROTON

## HUNTING IS <u>NOT ALLOWED</u> AT GROTON PLACE, AMES MEADOW, FLAVELL CROSSING, FOX RUN, GROTON HILLS, AND LONGLEY II CONSERVATION AREAS

## PLEASE BE ADVISED THAT THERE IS <u>NO HUNTING ON SUNDAYS</u> IN MASSACHUSETTS

- 1. All people are welcome to enjoy themselves without charge in Town-owned conservation areas of Groton from <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> hour after sunrise until <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> hour after sunset.
- 2. If not posted, conservation areas owned by the Town of Groton and managed by the Groton Conservation Commission may be hunted or fished in season with a license and in accord with applicable law.
  - Applicable law\* includes no discharge of firearms within 150 ft. of a hardsurfaced roadway or 500 ft. of an occupied building.

  - Wearing items of clothing in 'hunter orange' is strongly recommended during the above time periods.
- 3. Hunting is also ALLOWED within most of the New England Forestry Foundation parcels (bow hunting in Sabine Woods and Keyes Woods, but call 978-952-6856 to confirm). Hunting is also ALLOWED in Groton Town Forest; the Peter E. Bertozzi Wildlife Conservation Area along the Squannacook River; the Squannacook River Wildlife Management Area, adjoining the Groton Town Forest; J. Harry Rich State Forest; the Mason Back 100; and Gamlin Crystal Spring on Old Dunstable Road owned by the Groton Conservation Trust.
