Mr. Green called the regular session of the Finance Committee to order at 6:30 p.m.

Positions to be taken on Warrant Articles:

Article 8: Library Roof Design/Bidding (\$66,000) - The members discussed the Library Roof Design project and determined that those individuals who had previously deferred taking a position were now willing to support the project. Therefore, the Finance Committee members are now unanimously in favor of recommending this article to Town Meeting (7-0-0)

Article 7: Highway Garage Design/Bidding (\$230,000) – Mr. Prest and Ms. Leonard had previously voted to support this article, while the remaining members had deferred taking a position pending receipt of additional information. Mr. Green said he is still conflicted due to the high construction cost currently anticipated. He noted that this could be resolved by requesting that the Capital Planning Advisory Committee hold project costs to a predetermined amount. Mr. Manugian said that this article should have been presented in the spring, along with the new fiscal budget. The group discussed options for scheduling Town Meeting appropriation votes for design versus construction costs. Mr. Manugian would like to see all capital requests presented at one time so as to give the public a complete understanding of the financial implications and limitations. Upon completion of this discussion, it was determined that the majority of Finance Committee members was now in favor of supporting this article (5-1-1: Mr. Green does not support, and Mr. Doody was not present to take a position).

<u>Special Town Meeting Article 2: FY19 Budget Adjustments</u> – Mr. Robertson had previously deferred taking a position pending receipt of the 5-Year Forecast. He confirmed that he had received that document, however, the budgetary difficulty remains. The 5-Year Forecast indicates operating budget deficits for FY21 and beyond due to the decision to hire 2 additional fire fighters as well as the impact of the newly

settled collective bargaining agreements. The Finance Committee members determined that they now unanimously support this article (7-0-0).

Mr. Green officially adjourned the regular session of the Finance Committee at 6:50 p.m.; the members relocated to the PAC for the 2018 Fall Town Meeting beginning at 7:00 p.m.
