We require that you inform DIG SAFE seventy-two (72) hours prior to any construction start. We also require that you give a **MINIMUM OF FORTY-EIGHT (48) HOURS NOTICE** to the **Groton Water Department (978-443-1122), the Groton Highway Department (978-448-1162), and Pepperell Wastewater Treatment Business Manager Paul Brinkman (978-433-9859).**

Your license is valid for the person named therein and his/hers employees only. It does not permit work by sub-contractors. You must have a signed permit from the Sewer Commission before you begin to dig. If your license is not current, it will be invalid and you will not be permitted to work in Groton. In addition, we must have your current insurance information on file.

The Pepperell Sewer Department must inspect all work. Please call Pepperell Wastewater Treatment Business Manager Paul Brinkman (978) 433-9859 to schedule an appointment for the inspection before backfilling trenches.
