- ii. Standing Action Items:
- 2. The second order of business was: Review draft annual report
 - a. Annual report was edited with input and edits from Committee members
 - i. Olin Lathrop moved to approve annual report as edited
 - ii. Ann Carpenter seconded the motion
 - iii. Motion is approved by unanimous voice vote
- 3. The third order of business was: Discuss plans for 2025
 - a. Garlic Mustard Pull Event
 - i. Williams Barn was visited to determine if it would be a suitable location to hold the event
 - Jonathan Basch observed garlic mustard around the main field, and some along trail
 - a. There are multiple other species of invasives that can be removed, too
 - b. Committee may consider identifying and flagging invasives prior to event, for volunteers to remove
 - 2. Olin Lathrop: contact Williams Barn Committee to schedule use of the area for invasive removal event

ACTION ITEM: Jonathan Basch to contact Williams Barn Committee for possible use of site for event

- ii. Cow Pond fields & Prescott Fields also considered as possible options
 - 1. There may be competition for parking with other activities (i.e. youth sports) during a weekend
- iii. Incorporate invasive species removal with promotion of native plants. Committee will provide supervised instruction regarding identification, removal methods and treatments
- iv. Virginia Wood, a Groton citizen and local artist, has offered to donate handmade ceramic mugs as prize for any possible competition regarding invasive species removal
- v. Jonathan Basch: Time frame for event will be in mid-April
 - 1. Olin Lathrop: may be too early for growth, we should prioritize Japanese barberry removal in Town Forest and Lawrence Grove/Hemlock Woods first
 - 2. May consider event in April/May; will depend on availability and may be determined by Williams Barn Committee
- vi. Ann Carpenter: The Prescott Center is hosting upcoming presentations on invasive and native plants and have offered to advertise for the Invasive Species Committee's Garlic Mustard Pull/Invasive Species Removal event
 - 1. They could also possibly include in their next newsletter, which is distributed to residents outside Groton, which could increase participation
 - 2. Jonathan Basch: We can do an additional Invasive Removal Event at the Prescott Center, too, along the rear parking area, if there is interest
 - 3. Committee can provide existing brochures to hand out during presentations
