- 1. The first order of business was: Review minutes and action items from the May meeting
 - a. Minutes:
 - i. Review of minutes postponed until next meeting
 - b. Action Items:
 - i. Assigned Previously:
 - Ron Strohsahl to invite Marisa Browning-Kamins to attend Invasive Species Committee
 meeting in the future to explain the role of the invasive coordinator position and identify
 ways we can assist
 - a. Completed Marisa has agreed to attend when more information is available. She is awaiting budget information from Wild and Scenic Rivers Committee
 - 2. **Charlotte Weigel** to find latitude/longitude of Japanese barberry stand in Sawtell Conservation Area (Parcel 232-9) and Torrey Woods (Parcel 231-94)
 - a. Pending
 - 3. **Olin Lathrop** to find contact for Webbers to get permission to treat tree-of-heaven (*Ailanthus altissima*) on Gibbet Hill
 - a. Olin contacted Webbers, but Adam Burnett identified suspected plants as black walnut (*Juglans nigra*) saplings, thus no treatment is necessary
 - ii. New Action Items from May meeting:
 - 1. **Olin Lathrop** to schedule treatment of ash (*Fraxinus* spp.) trees at Deerhaven (Parcels 127-12, 127-40) this coming weekend (May 21-22) or following weekend depending on

- 2. Adam Burnett to send email to Charlotte Steeves at Conservation Committee before treating the Asiatic bittersweet (*Celastrus orbiculatus*) at Farmers and Mechanics Club site (Parcel 217-78)
 - a. Completed, Asiatic bittersweet located and treated

- 4. **Olin Lathrop** to share listserv information and article on Japanese knotweed treatment to the Committee

 - a. Completed, ongoing. Meeting date to be determined by Wild & Scenic Committee member's schedules
- 9. **Charlotte Weigel** to survey for Japanese knotweed (*Reynoutria japonica*) and tree-of-heaven at GELD property (Parcel 113-51)
 - a. Completed by Adam Burnett and Jonathan Basch. There is more Japanese knotweed than expected following last year's treatment. Plants were treated with glyphosate in a combination of foliar spray or cut/dab technique
- 10. **Olin Lathrop** to visit Lost Lake Fire station (Parcel 125-83) to check on regrowth of tree-of-heaven
 - a. Completed, updated via email on 6/25/25. Treatment was effective.
- 11. **Adam Burnett** to treat Japanese knotweed regrowth with diluted triclopyr at Nod Road (Parcels 216-63)
 - a. Pending
- 2. The second order of business was: Debrief on recent events; Riverfest and Lingering Ash lecture
 - a. Groton Riverfest (Sunday, June 8, 2025, 10am-4pm)
 - i. Committee members distributed invasive species treatment brochures and children enjoyed completing the scavenger hunt
 - b. Lingering Ash Lecture (Wednesday, June 11, 2025, 7:00pm)
 - i. Very informative presentation from Nicole Keleher, Forest Health Director from Department of Conservation and Recreation



- ii. It is too early to determine whether Groton has lingering ash trees, or if they haven't been affected by emerald ash borer yet
- iii. Ms. Keleher detailed methods for recording and reporting lingering ash to identify specimens
- iv. Approximately 30 people in attendance including 5 members of Committee
- 3. The third order of business was: Schedule for upcoming treatments/events
 - a. Groton Electric & Light Department (GELD; Parcel 113-51)
 - i. treatment completed on 6/14 (see discussed May Action Item #9)
 - b. Country Club (Parcel 115-33)
 - i. treatment of Japanese knotweed completed on 6/14
 - ii. Black swallow-wort (Cynanchum louiseae) observed and confirmed near driving range
 - c. Surrenden Farm (Parcel 210-8)
 - i. treatment and restoration has been very successful, almost no Japanese knotweed remaining in that section along Nashua River
 - ii. Foliar spraying of remaining Japanese knotweed completed on 6/22 by Jonathan Basch and Adam Burnett
 - 1. Additional tentative treatment on Saturday 6/28
 - d. Nod Road (Parcel 216-63)
 - i. needs treatment, Adam Burnett has been assigned Action Item
 - e. Emerald Ash Borer treatment at Deerhaven
 - i. Olin has equipment, treatment tentatively scheduled for Sunday 6/29
 - f. Japanese knotweed at Groton School property in road easement along Route 111 across from General Field (Parcel 219-2?)
 - i. Treated last year with approval from Groton School
 - ii. Jonathan Basch requested and received permission to treat again in 2025
 - 1. Will treat when re-treating Surrenden Farm, late summer
- 4. The fourth order of business was: Japanese knotweed along Townsend Road (MBTA property)
 - a. Moved to next meeting
- 5. The fifth order of business was: Town of Stow Japanese knotweed homeowner eradication permit
 - a. Moved to next meeting
- 6. The sixth order of business was: Membership discussion
 - a. Jacob Llodra attended this meeting
 - i. Definitely interested in participating and helping with treatments
 - ii. Interest in joining Committee in future
- 7. The seventh order of business was: All other business
 - a. Olin Lathrop & Ron Strohsahl discussed using volunteers to create grid treatment pattern through Town Forest, based upon information from Chris Polatin presented at Nashua River Watershed Association Invasive Species Coordination conference
 - Create grid on properties using GIS, allow volunteers to walk to center of each cell and rate area for % of invasives



- 1. Jonathan Basch suggests "stewards" of specific properties to help identify and map same property over time
- 2. Committee can only treat what we see, so all additional information is helpful for locating invasive populations
- ii. Groton Trails Committee has interactive map and can upload observations directly to the map
 - 1. Can users identify and upload invasive sightings to Trails Committee map and then they could forward to us?

- c. Japanese knotweed brochures in Prescott Center need restocking
