It seems to me that sometimes good things in life appear to simply fall into our laps. At times we have to work hard to achieve a goal and then other times, wow, it's just right there. We, the COA and seniors of Groton, are going to benefit from a WOW moment. It's an involved story to explain how quickly this happened but let's just say that once in a while it pays to ask for the sky. Through the generosity of the Groton Board of Selectman, Lowell Regional Transit Authority and the State of Massachusetts, beginning approximately July 1, 2014 we will have medical van service to Boston area hospitals including; Mass General, Dana Farber, Brigham and Women's and the Boston VA. We will also serve Lahey, Emerson and Bedford VA. This van will run on Tuesdays and Thursdays with Tuesday dedicated to Boston hospitals and Thursdays serving Emerson, Burlington and Bedford. The Tuesday/Thursday schedule will be preliminary as we get an idea of what works best for our residents. Scheduling can be challenging in the beginning so we encourage everyone to call about appointments even if you can't get them on the days we've requested however, we will be working toward the definitive Tuesday/ Thursday schedule. This will be a process that will take some trial and error to perfect so please bear with us. As a side note, this service is available to residents in surrounding towns, with the van leaving from the Groton Senior Center for non-residents.

We look forward to serving our residents with this service and encourage you to call with any questions or concerns you may have.

Hi Everyone,

I'm here to help and serve all of you. Some of you may not know all of the ways in which I can help or assist you. Here are some services you may not be aware of:

<u>Home Visits</u> – There are situations in which a senior cannot come to the Senior Center. I understand this and am happy to meet with you in your home.

<u>Food Stamp Applications</u> – I have simplified SNAP applications that I can assist eligible seniors in filling out. Once done, we can fax it to the local DTA office, which saves time and money.

<u>Lifeline Emergency Alert System</u> – I have coupons that will waive the Activation Fee of \$70.00.

<u>Safelink Free Cell Phone Applications</u> – This is a government program that provides free cell phones to low income seniors. I have applications and am happy to help you through the process.

RMV Disabled Placards Applications – Call or stop by for an application.

<u>Chore Corp</u> – I have a few volunteers that are able to do small repairs for seniors on a fixed income. Please contact me if you need a small repair done.

<u>Phone Wellness</u> – I'm happy to call any senior that has been ill, had surgery, lost a spouse, daily to make sure they are doing well and have everything they **need to ease the process.**

<u>Farmers Market Coupons</u> – This is a Federal government program in which free Farmer's Market coupons are provided to Groton seniors that are income eligible. There are limited quanities issued to Groton are available on a first-come, first-serve basis. They usually arrive in July, so please call me if you feel you qualify.

The SHINE Program (Serving the Health Insurance Needs of Everyone) is a state health insurance assistance program that provides free health insurance information, counseling and assistance to Massachusetts residents with Medicare and their caregivers. It is administered by the Massachusetts Executive Office of Elder Affairs in partnership with the Councilon Aging. Through my office I can make referrels for your individual appointment with a counselor.

Spring is here, and we've all been waiting long and hard to spend time outside! The Groton Fire Department owns the beautiful piece of property with the pond, next to our building. Medicare Appeals

If you have Medicare, you have the right to appeal decisions you disagree with. All steps in the appeal process have specific time frames and other requirements. *It is very important to pay attention to the time limits for appeals!*

Some appealable situations are:

Medicare denies your request for a health care service, supply, or prescription

Medicare denies payment for health care that you have already received

Medicare stops covering services that you are receiving

Medicare pays a different amount than you believe it should

For assistance with appeals, the Medicare Advocacy Project (MAP) provides free advice and legal representation. MAP can assist anyone with Original Medicare or a Medicare Advantage Plan,
