Senior Soundings

June 30<sup>th</sup> marks the end of the year at the senior center, our budget and our program schedule run July 1<sup>st</sup> – June 30<sup>th</sup> each year. Overall it was a very good year. We had some disappointments; cancelling of Ballroom Dancing, the Luau, Zumba, Father's Day Breakfast, a couple of trips and the meditation class due to lack of registrants but overall we saw great growth and enthusiasm.

951 seniors used the center's programs and services this year, an increase of 187 participants from the previous year.

We offered 43 programs (non-outreach) compared to 29 the previous year. We added two new areas for service; garden club and producer of our TV program in collaboration with the Groton Channel.

The number of van riders is equal to the previous year however; the number of rides has increased by 338.

The number of volunteer hours has decreased by 387 hours.

Outreach services touched the lives of 397 residents, an increase of 52 served from the previous year.

Goal setting is important to the staff at the COA and while we may not always reach them, it keeps the carrot in front of us so we are always striving for excellence. This past year we had hopes to increase participation by 2.5% and exceeded that with an 8% growth. We wanted to increase programming by 25% and saw a 31% increase. We completed a policy manual, reviewed our By-laws and established a Future Planning Committee. Staff attended training and through our program evaluations we found that 99% of you learned something new through our educational programs, 93% reported feeling more socially connected by attended and 100% felt you were treated well by staff (thank you!). We completed our garden thanks to the collaboration of so many people but will move the goal of horseshoes and bocce ball to next year. We had hoped to see an increase in Meals on Wheels clients however actually saw a decline and will work harder to get the word out about this essential service. We would like to have programs for men but have yet to find the perfect (or at least near perfect) match with the offerings of the past year. Stacey's office, well we didn't quite get to it last year but construction did begin July 15 thanks to Tom Delany and Groton DPW! Kathv

I hope your enjoying this beautiful weather! I just wanted make you aware of some services that are available to seniors, that you may not know about.

I just wanted to remind everyone that the <u>Senior Center is a</u> <u>Cooling Area</u> for residents during the summer months. If you don't have AC or if your AC is broken, please feel free to come in to get out of the heat!!!

As of July 1, 2014 Montachusett Opportunity Council began a new program called the **Elder Services Home Repair Program**. This program can pay for essential home repairs up to \$3,000.00. MOC will coordinate the process for you. For more information, please call 1-978-342-7025 Ext. – 306.

The **Attorney General's Office** has a statewide, toll-free telephone hotline to assist individuals with a wide range of elderly issues. This is a valuable service offered to MA senior citizens, family members, and care givers seeking information about elder-related issues with programming throughout the Commonwealth. They are open Monday-Friday 10:00 AM – 4:00 PM - 1-888-243-5337 (TTY: 617-727-4765).

**Community Legal Aid** provides free civil legal service to those most in need. They provide legal services for people age 60 and over in cases involving safety from abuse, access to affordable housing, access to government benefits, senior housing issues, landlord problems, and much more. CLA's phone number is 508-752-3718 Monday – Friday, 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. They have a satellite office where they can meet with you in Fitchburg. If you need transportation to their Fitchburg office, please call us about this ahead of time.

## **NEWS FROM SHINE AUGUST 2014**

<u>The SHINE Program (Serving the Health Insurance Needs of Everyone)</u> is a state health insurance assistance program that provides free health insurance information, counseling and assistance to Massachusetts **residents with Medicare and their caregivers**. *I*t is administered by the Massachusetts Executive Office of Elder Affairs in partnership with the Councilon Aging. Through the COA referrels for your individual appointment with a counselor can be made.

If you have Medicare, you have the right to appeal decisions you disagree with. All steps in the appeal process have specific time frames and other requirements. *It is very important to pay attention to the time limits for appeals!* 

Some appealable situations are:

Medicare denies your request for a health care service, supply, or prescription

Medicare denies payment for health care that you have already received

Medicare stops covering services that you are receiving

Medicare pays a different amount than you believe it should

For assistance with appeals, the Medicare Advocacy Project (MAP) provides free advice and legal representation. MAP can assist anyone with Original Medicare or a Medicare Advantage Plan, regardless of income. For assistance from MAP, call the Mass. Senior Legal Helpline at 866-778-0939
