

Emergency Preparedness Forms: The COA works in collaboration with the Groton Police, Fire, and EMS to ensure senior and/or disabled residents are safe in the event of a severe weather emergency. The information you provide on this form is confidential, and will only be used in the event of a severe weather emergency to ensure you are safe and comfortable. If you don't fill out one of these forms, you will not go into our database, and we will not necessarily be aware of where you live and/or what your needs are in the event of an emergency. If you haven't already filled out one of these forms, I strongly encourage you to do so. If you need a form, please contact me.

Options Counseling through Montachusett Home Care Corp: Options Counseling is a FREE service that assists people in making informed choices about long term care services, resources & supports. A major goal of Options Counseling is to assist individuals to remain in the community, safely and independently. To speak to an Options Counselor, call Montachusett Home Care at 978-537-7411.

<u>Fuel Assistance Applications:</u> The fuel assistance season is November 1, 2014 through April 30, 2015. If you'd like to see if you may qualify for assistance, or if you need help filling out your fuel assistance application, please contact me.

NEWS FROM SHINE NOVEMBER 2014

MEDICARE OPEN ENROLLMENT UPDATE MEETING PLAN YEAR 2015

The Medicare Open Enrollment ends on <u>December 7th</u>! Don't Wait Until It's Too Late! Make a SHINE Appointment Now!

Every year, Medicare Part D and Medicare Advantage (HMO, PPO) plans can change their premiums, co-pays, deductibles, formularies (list of drugs covered) and preferred pharmacies. It's important to review your options EVERY year to make sure you have the plan that works best for you for next year.



Trained SHINE (Serving Health Information Needs of Everyone) volunteers can help you! They offer free, unbiased, confidential counseling on all aspects of health insurance to anyone on Medicare. Call your senior center and ask for a SHINE appointment. You can also call 1-800-AGE-INFO (1-800-243-4636), then press or say 3. Once you get the SHINE answering machine, leave your name and number. A volunteer will call you back. During Open Enrollment it may take a couple of days to return your call. You can now visit us on the internet at shinema.org

Assistance is available from the SHINE program. Call the senior center and ask for a SHINE appointment. Trained SHINE volunteers offer free, confidential counseling on all aspects of health insurance to anyone on Medicare. You may also contact Medicare directly at 1-800-MEDICARE.

"SHINE'S MEDICARE AND MORE" PROGRAM

The Central MASS SHINE Program is now sponsoring a monthly cable tv program called SHINE's MEDICARE AND MORE", we hope your local cable channel will pick it up. This program is designed to educate and update MEDICARE beneficiaries and their families on MEDICARE and other programs that can assist you with your health insurance needs. If you don't see it on your local cable channel give them call and ask about it.


The Nashoba Valley Elder Law Project, part of Community Legal Aid, will offer a two part program:
