- o Carl: Sustainability diagram: apollonian thinking: sustainability is about balance.
- Steve: There isn't a balance now. Problem with the master plan is that we have to fight the balance and decide what is most important.
- o Mike: Have to consider what is most threatened.
- O Steve: Biggest threat should get the most attention.
- Leo: Have to monitor tail events, things with low probability of happening but would have a high impact if they did.
- o Carl: Need to restrain use of resources.
- Steve: loaded words related to sustainability: preserve, adapt, self-sufficient, thriving, balance, long-term, healthy, respect, considerate.
- o Leo: Have to have things that make people stop and make choices.
- o Mike: Have to pay attention to what people really care about.
