## Minutes:

Called to Order- 7:00 pm

- Consider alternate date for November Commission meeting currently, November 21st (ALL) [5 min]
  - The group agreed to change the November meeting date to November 28th at 7pm
- Finalize Calendar Year 2024 Strategic Planning & Priorities, Part 2 of 2 (ALL).
  - All of the initiatives for 2024 were listed on the wall
  - Members who proposed an initiative were allowed to provide supporting information about the initiative, including more details and the rationale for proposing
  - A few initiatives were automatically removed
    - Promote/participate in gleaning program
    - Use town meeting as an opportunity to promote sustainability and long-term planning
    - Sustainable Groton footprint stamps on sidewalks in town
    - Formulate more subcommittees this was removed because there are specific subcommittees proposed in other initiatives
  - Here are the nine items that were selected by the 8 participants to drive our strategic direction in 2024 along with their vote totals (sometimes, thanks to the ballot-stuffing enabled by multivoting with our colored dots, in excess of 100%)
    - Climate Action Plan (CAP) -- 13 votes (162.5%)
      - Continue to visit other stakeholder groups in town and share inventory and next steps some detailed below
      - Propose clean energy/climate resolution at town meeting
      - Secure funding for CAP or decarbonization plan, develop CAP or decarbonization plan,
      - Propose specialized building stretch code at town meeting
      - Continue to work on Green Communities 1.0 (fall 2024 grant proposal)
    - Form Grant Subcommittee -- 9 votes (112.5%)
      - Work with other subcommittees to find grants, write proposals, and administer grants
    - Continue Education Seminars -- 8 votes (100%)
      - As planned continuation of seminar series, include two outdoor sessions/year ( EVs, forest walks)
      - Take education series in some form into grammar school,
    - Communications & Social Media Subcommittee -- 8 votes (100%)
      - Formalize subcommittee, develop website and support social media presence, consider using MassEnergize for website, have a presence at Town Meetings

- Pollinator Corridor and Habitat Garden -- 8 votes (100%)
  - Includes forming Subcommittee
- Continue Free Tire Recycling Program -- 7 votes (87.5%)
- Electrification Advocacy 7 votes (87.5%)
  - Includes electric golf carts, DPW use of electric-powered equipment and pushing GELD to have more progressive policies
- Formalize the Sustainable Groton Advocate Program -- 5 votes (62.5%)
  - Formalize expectations of advocates and how to become an advocate and promote program – target 500 advocates by 2024 year end
- Decarbonize Schools 5 votes (62.5%)
  - Includes work beyond Green Communities
- o Items not selected included:
  - Form More Liaisons (attend other meetings including capital planning, Destination Groton 250<sup>th</sup> celebration, Trails, Community Preservation Committee (2),
  - eBike Rentals at Groton Rail Trail (2),
  - Address Noise Pollution (gas-powered leaf blowers and traffic in Groton Center) (1),
  - Transportation Advocacy (more sidewalks, bikeability, public transport/carpooling advocacy),
  - Carbon Sequestration survey work,
  - Restaurant food recycling/composting program
  - Host Annual "Lights Out Groton" Night,
  - Host "Sustainable Groton Night" at Gibbet Hill
  - Create a Clearinghouse and Document Available Funding Programs
